It is with great enthusiasm that as of July 1, 2018, I will be joining the Adult Education Division Team in the role of Assistant Principal of Adult Education at The Burlington County Institute of Technology. As a life-long resident of Burlington County, I come to you having served in prior roles within the district, at the BCIT-Medford Campus. I was hired in April of 2006 as a Health and Physical Education Teacher. From 2006 until 2015 I also served in various roles such as Assistant Girls and Boys Basketball Coach and Assistant Boys Soccer Coach. I also was the Head Baseball Coach and Head Teacher for the Health and Physical Education Department. In August of 2015, I was appointed interim Assistant Principal/Athletic Director at BCIT-Medford.
